6:16	Multi Intensive Program at HANE: Multi-Intensive (MI) Program to service more intensive special needs in our community. The funding for the program is to come from the district in order to meet the special education minutes for each student. Because of the required minutes and the enrollment of students after October count, we have a need of an additional person above and beyond the funds provided by the district. Sara requests that the board provide the funds to hire this person for the remainder of the year. With the plan to work this salary into the budget for next year. Projected cost \$14,000 Motion: To allocate and approve use of reserves to hire special education assistant. (Moved by Jonathan, seconded by Zach, passed unanimously).	Principals - Sara Alesandrini and Kali Garofoli
	Free and Reduced Lunch Update: HANE campus is calculated at 55% free and reduced lunch and HASE campus is calculated at 34%. Neither currently meet the 60% threshold to qualify as a Title 1 school. CCSI-CDE Grant Update: Site visit in February for the \$600,000 grant over 3 from CDE. This visit will not affect the status of the grant but will provide feedback for the formation of the school. On February 22-24, all board members will be interviewed as a part of a compressive rubric for the school.	

During the January board meeting, time will be allocated to prepare for interview in order to present a clear message. CDE will report their findings to the board in March or April. **Enrollment Update:** HANE is fully enrolled with additional openings in the MI program. The first open house is in December. Choice officially opens in January this year. HASE is currently at 508. **Staffing Update HASE:** The team has recently hired PE teacher, Harry Sledge. **Professional Development:** HANE has focused PD time on ELD trainings. In addition, a newly formed Developing Leaders team will take on the CSSI visit preparations. At HASE, the faculty has invited observers and teachers to visit classrooms to offer feedback. 6:45 Strategic Planning Updates The Board approved a 5-year plan of expansion, with an ultimate goal to President serve an additional 500 students. Due to leadership changes in the Tom Bulger organization, this is Yr 0 (2015-16), with a target date for completion of Yr 5 (2020-21)Discussion of Year 0 goals: 1. Analyze the ED role, identify and hire new ED; 2. Institutionalization of Board knowledge; a. Revamp of bylaws: language issues that needed to be cleaned up. Need to do a first read of updated draft, followed by a formal vote at next meeting. b. Policy Manual and guideline update and review (Need to rewrite policies to reflect the leadership of the principals and ED). 3. Increase Board capacity to meet strategic goals; a. Board recruitment: Losing two board members this year, so

need to start thinking about new board members and recruitment; explore using the winter concerts for

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	recruitment; use Advisory board to help with recruitment. b. Continue board development sessions (held immediately before monthly board meetings) 4. Improve community relations a. Update website content on board page b. Board presence at HANE and HASE events 5. Increase internal leadership capacity: Covered in school updates section of agenda.

Finance Committee: The Committee met on Thursday, November 12. In attendance were: Jonathan Tee, David Larm, Tom Bulger, Kali Garofoli, Sara Alesandrini and Lori Deacon. The committee reviewed budget vs. actuals for HASE and HANE. With a baseline of 33% both campuses revenues and expenses are in line for this time of year. HASE revenues are 48% and expenses are 38% (trending high in some categories due to timing). HANE revenues are 45% and expenses are 30%. Time was also spent discussing the "Appropriate Reserves" line item, which is new to our budget per a requirement from CDE and DPS. The Committee then began a review of Financial Policies. At the next committee meeting, members will finish their review of financial policies and procedures, in order to make recommendations to the Board at the January meeting.
